# **Questions:**

- 1. The government says that it will continue to deal with the National Congress of Australia's First Peoples as a national representative body. Please advise how Congress is to be engaged and whether formal and regular meetings are in place with Congress?
- 2. In terms of engagement with Congress how does government plan to be better informed and have better capacity to govern Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander affairs through its engagement with Congress?
- 3. What has Congress proposed to government in terms of engagement and better forms of governance?

### **Answers:**

- 1. The Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet has regular contact with the National Congress of Australia's First Peoples.
- 2. Engagement with the National Congress is considered continually. The Minister for Indigenous Affairs and his office meet with the Congress when appropriate. Congress provides submissions to government reviews.
