These include outstanding leadership, dedication to collaboration and building sustainable relationships and innovative solutions.
 - d. Service Pins custom made rectangular pin with an image of parliament house.

e. Service Pins - \$971.50 (bulk order of pins).

Secretary's Award - \$41.75 (for printing).
