1. What are considered to be the primary issues of contention that resulted in a vote of seventy-three percent against the proposed agreement?

2. Can a revised timetable for negotiation be provided?

#### **Answer**

- 1. DPS is unable to provide the primary issues of contention until the results of the survey being run from 15 March to 6 April 2017 have been analysed and considered. DPS will then need to consider whether to seek further feedback via focus groups before deciding on how to proceed.
- 2. Until these steps are completed DPS is unable to provide a revised timetable for negotiations. Employees were advised that it would be around mid-2017 before another offer could be made. On that basis, efforts will be made to reformulate an offer at the earliest opportunity.
