(Note four Graduates under the Whole-of-Government ICT Graduate Program and two Indigenous Graduates through the APSC Indigenous Pathways Program also commenced at Finance in 2014). 2. Subject to APSC approval, it is anticipated that the intake for 2015 will be twenty-one Finance Graduates, four Graduates under the Whole-of-Government ICT Graduate Program and one Indigenous Graduate through the APSC Indigenous Pathways Program. 3. There is a slight reduction reflecting business needs. 4. No.
Australian Electoral Commission	 383 applications received, four accepted. Nil. Yes. Reduction was a result of a change to the AEC budget and reallocation of internal funds to other programs. The AEC has adjusted its priorities and decided not to run a graduate program in 2015. No.
ComSuper	ComSuper does not run an agency graduate program.
