Answer:

- 1. A deregulation unit for the Department's portfolio has been established within the Programme and Support Division, with responsibility for coordinating and implementing the Government's deregulation agenda within the PM&C portfolio.
 - 1. Parliamentary Secretary to the Prime Minister the Hon Josh Frydenberg outlined the Department's progress against the red tape reduction target to Parliament on 19 March 2014.
 - 2. Staffing numbers for the unit vary at any one time according to specific workload requirements. Current staffing for the PM&C Deregulation Unit

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comprises: 1 x SES1 at 25 per cent full time equivalent; and 2 x EL2, 3 x EL1, 1 x APS6 and 1 x APS4, all full time. Staffing is higher at this time as substantial deregulation work is being completed to ensure the new Indigenous Advancement Programme has significantly less red tape.

- 3-4 Deregulation Unit staff transferred to the Department following the September 2013 machinery of government changes.
- 5. The Deregulation Unit is resourced from existing Departmental funds.
- 6. The estimated total salary cost of the officers assigned to the unit as at 6 June 2014 was \$178,700, noting that the Deregulation Unit was first established in December 2013 and that not all officers have been in the Deregulation Unit since that time.
