Senator FAULKNER: One of the videos is entitled, "A message from the Prime Minister—WA Senate election". It was posted on Sunday 30 March. I think the Senate election was on 5 April in WA, as you would recall. The question I have goes to the issue of authorisation, which of course is a requirement of the Commonwealth Electoral Act. I raised this earlier and I had hoped some advice might have been provided in the meantime. Minister, can you indicate to the committee what the obligations are in relation to this?

Senator Abetz: Look, I cannot. I can take that question on notice. But my first thoughts in relation to the matter would be that this is clearly an identifiable video on a clearly identified site. The ownership, operation et cetera is well known; therefore, whether specific authorisation has to occur on that, I do not know. We will get an answer on notice to you.

Answer:

The *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918* outlines obligations in relation to authorisation of electoral material.
