What were these 'former efficiencies'? When were they put in place?

Does 'maintaining at nominal levels' effectively mean a freeze in indexation for those programs?

Answer:

The former efficiencies and the relevant original measures extended in the measure 'Attorney-General's Portfolio – efficiencies' were as follows:

- Australia New Zealand Counter Terrorism Committee: *Attorney-General's Portfolio savings redirection*, 2013-14 Budget measure;
- International Criminal Court contribution: *Attorney-General's Portfolio savings redirection*, 2013-14 Budget measure;
- Family Relationship Services Programme: Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse offsets, 2014-15 MYEFO measure;
- The Grants to Australian Organisations Programme Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse offsets, 2014-15 MYEFO measure; and
- Payments to the States under the Family Law Act 1975: Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse offsets, 2014-15 MYEFO measure.

The programmes are indexed, with the index applied to the current base.
