Senator WONG: If I may Mr Fraser, given that we know the Governor-General hosts functions, how would you like it phrased such that we are able to get an answer to the costs of those functions, rather than getting into a lawyer's argument, some might say a pedant's argument, about the difference between the Office of the Governor-General, or was it the Official Secretary of the Governor-General and the Governor-General himself because I assume he does not actually pay out of his own pocket. So how would you like it phrased so I actually get a response?

Mr Fraser: If you would like to direct the question to that and ask for the hospitality costs relating to functions hosted by the Governor-General.

Senator WONG: Thank you.

Mr Fraser: We would take that on notice.

Senator WONG: Can I please have the cost of hospitality of functions hosted by the Governor-

General for the current financial year to date and the previous financial year.

Answer:

Each year, around 40,000 guests visit Government House and Admiralty House. Guests include visiting Heads of State, foreign officials, community leaders, representatives of the many organisations of which the Governor-General and Lady Cosgrove are Patron, school students and members of the public during scheduled open days.

The format of hospitality offered by the Governor-General varies depending on the nature of the event. One of the primary principles in planning is to ensure that the arrangements for a function

best meet the business and operational needs with the most efficient and effective use of resources.

The Office does not record details of the cost of hospitality on a function by function basis, and it would be an unreasonable diversion of resources to collate. However the tables below provide an estimate of the food and beverage costs, per function type, for functions hosted by the Governor-General at Government House and Admiralty House, based on an average cost per head for each function type.
