#### **Ouestion:**

Senator LUDWIG: There has been a question about that being on notice and not being answered. But can we have a look at those FOIs that you have on hand. I am happy for you to take it on notice. It would be helpful if you could provide us with a list of the FOI requests that you currently have—is my microphone on; can you hear me fine?—Ms Kelly: Yes.

Senator LUDWIG: and then the issue, if possible—I do not want the identifiers—and those which are past the date when the FOI request should have been dealt with, and how many there have been over the last 12 months. That would be helpful.

Ms Kelly: Can you just clarify what you mean by 'issue' so that I understand the request? Senator LUDWIG: At least not calling it 'FOI1' or 'FOI2'—some way of describing what the FOI request is about. It depends on the nature of what you can provide. I do understand the difficulty.

Ms Kelly: Yes. We will endeavour to—

Senator LUDWIG: But not the person, clearly, who was putting the FOI request in. What I am really interested in is: how many FOI requests have been made, how many have been answered on time and how many have not been answered on time?

Ms Kelly: The difficulty that we have had with that question when you have asked it previously is that we do not centrally record that information, so, in order to—

Senator LUDWIG: Maybe I am encouraging you to do that.

Ms Kelly: That is something that I can take on board, but, in relation to the past year, we have not centrally recorded that. We can certainly give you a list, but, in terms of saying when they were answered and why they were not answered on time, that would require us to go back to each individual file, so our previous responses to you when you have asked that have been that we just do not have that information to hand.

#### **Answer:**

A list of freedom of information requests made to the Department on hand as at 26 May 2015, showing whether the access decision on each request was within the standard time frames provided under the FOI Act or was overdue, is below.
