## **Question:**

Senator MOORE: Well COAG is now the senior group. Why is that difficult? Would it not be a question, Minister, to your COAG comrades to say: what is the Queensland commitment to domestic violence, what is the New South Wales commitment to domestic violence? Senator Cash: We could obviously take that on notice for you. It is a whole-of-government issue and then you would need to go to each state individually and ask what is their actual spend because a lot of what the Commonwealth funds is matched by the states. Then in terms of where the state itself prioritises, that would obviously be an item for each individual state.
