Senator GALLAGHER: ... In terms of higher education, I will ask some questions around Budget Paper No. 2, pages 81 to 84. If we can get a bit more detail—I think this would probably have to be on notice—on the impact of each individual measure in the two higher education reform measures' descriptions, as there are outlined, in total and for each year of the forward estimates in fiscal balance and underlying cash. Shall I keep going? You have not told me no yet.

Senator Cormann: We will take it on notice.

Senator GALLAGHER: You have not told me no. I am waiting for you to say no.

Senator Cormann: If you want to have answers in the committee—it is an Education question. But if you want to put it on notice, it would be helpful, as always.

Senator GALLAGHER: Okay, all right: the total savings arising from the efficiency dividend of 2½ per cent on the Commonwealth Grant Scheme for the years 2018 and 2019, the extension of the demand-driven funding system to sub-bachelor places, the cessation of loadings for enabling courses, the impact of moving New Zealanders and permanent residents from Commonwealth supported places to full fee places, changes to HELP repayments and indexation arrangements, cuts to the Commonwealth supported places for postgraduate students, measures associated with reform to the Higher Education Participation and Partnerships Program and extension of the Commonwealth support for work experience in industry units. That would be useful.

A breakdown of the 2017-18 Budget measure *Higher Education Reform – a more sustainable higher education sector* is as follows, in fiscal balance (FB) and underlying cash balance (UCB) terms:

¹ This component of the measure was costed as part of a package consisting of several elements which are interlinked. The elements include: introducing an efficiency dividend of 2.5 per cent in 2018 and 2019 on the CGS; rebalancing contributions towards course fees by increasing student contributions through HELP by 7.5 per cent; adjustments to CGS cluster rates resulting from the impact of the efficiency dividend and rebalanced contributions to base funding rates; and extending the existing medical loading to include veterinary studies and dental studies from 2018 to alleviate the underfunding of these disciplines.
