Question:

Senator GALLAGHER: Who has responsibility for the contingency reserve?

Senator Cormann: It is part of the consolidated fund.

Senator GALLAGHER: Treasury, ultimately.

Senator Cormann: No, it is the budget. Finance and Treasury are jointly responsible for the budget papers, but it is not a specific allocation to a specific agency.

Senator GALLAGHER: Is that going to continue? There has been \$48 million, I think, of the modernisation fund that has been allocated to the national institutions this year. I have just spent the morning talking to them about it. How much of the \$500 million modernisation fund has now been determined via various projects?

Senator Cormann: All of it has been allocated.

Senator GALLAGHER: All of it has been allocated in this budget?

Senator Cormann: Yes. As of this budget, all of it has been allocated.

Senator GALLAGHER: That is those 4 dot points on page 2, is that right?

Ms Huxtable: Yes, that is right.

Senator GALLAGHER: And they have been allocated over various years, depending on the nature of the project and its capital and operational requirement?

Ms Huxtable: Yes, it is a three-year allocation to 2019-20. But, obviously, the profiles will vary depending on the projects.

Senator GALLAGHER: To put all that together, you would have to work through various agencies.

Senator Cormann: If that is a way of asking the question, 'Can you give us a list of all of the measures that are funded out of this?' then that—

Senator GALLAGHER: I will. If I cannot find it easily, yes, I will have someone else find it for me.

Senator Cormann: We will take that on notice. I am sure we can assist you with that. I remember seeing a list as part of the government deliberations, so it should not be hard for us to get back to you.
