Senator KITCHING: Could I ask about the Commission of Audit. Obviously, that ceased in

March 2014, but are any of the recommendations still being implemented?

**Senator Cormann:** I will take that on notice.

**Senator KITCHING:** If there is anything being implemented, would you be able to list what

is?

Senator Cormann: Obviously, it is a matter of looking back at the recommendations and

matching that up with government policy. I have taken it on notice.

**Senator KITCHING:** Are any recommendations still under consideration?

**Senator Cormann:** It is the same question.

**Senator KITCHING:** Not being implemented but under consideration—it is just broader.
