Question:

On his register of Senator's interests, Senator Roberts lists himself as the 'voluntary project manager of the Galileo Movement'.

According to the public record – the movement is not registered as a political party, nor is it registered as a charity.

The movement accepts donations via a range of matters – and Senator Roberts is himself featured in a YouTube video where he discusses receiving donations from pensioners.

Given the group is still active – evidenced through an active social media presence, I just want to clarify the requirements around political actors such as this.

- 1. Does the group need to register itself with the AEC as an associated entity?
- 2. Has the group or Senator Roberts ever contacted the AEC about that, or clarified their requirements around donations, disclosure, or authorisation?
- 3. If not: Are the actions of the movement legal given their actions?
- 4. Has the AEC taken any action (including making inquiries) to ensure Senator Roberts' fundraising via his Galileo Movement is within the rules?

Answer:

- 1. No, associated entities are not registered with the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC).
- 2. No.
- 3. The AEC administers Part XX of the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918* which deals with the financial disclosure of participants in the electoral process. The Galileo Movement does not appear to have had a disclosure obligation.
- 4. No, the AEC will work with entities to clarify their status and any possible disclosure obligations.
