RECENT TRENDS


The following data shows trends and comparisons in the activities of Senate committees:

- The 43rd parliament experienced an increase in the total number of matters referred to standing committees. There were a total of 321 references to standing committees in the 43rd parliament compared to 300 references in the 42nd and 234 in the 41st respectively (see graph 1).
- During the 43rd parliament, there was also an increase in the number of committee reports tabled. A total of 507 reports were tabled in the last parliament, an increase from 462 reports in the 42nd parliament and 388 in the 41st parliament (see graph 3).
- The number of public hearings (excluding estimates hearings) increased in 2012-13 to 183. 144 public hearings were held in 2011-12 and 118 in 2010-11 (see graph 4).
- The busiest committees at any one time during the 43rd parliament have been the Legal and Constitutional Affairs committees, which have twice dealt with a maximum of 12 references at one time (in November 2010 and May 2011) and the Rural and Regional Affairs and Transport committees, which managed 12 references simultaneously during March 2013.
- So far in this calendar year 2013, the Rural and Regional Affairs and Transport committees have tabled 31 reports, the Legal and Constitutional Affairs committees have tabled 27 and the Environment and Communications committees 25.
- At present, there are no select or joint select committees administered by the Senate Department in operation.


Staffing: at present, there are 57 Full Time Equivalent staff in the Committee Office (see FTE graph). A small amount of recruiting has been undertaken to ensure there is adequate support for Committees when the 43rd parliament resumes.

Cost of running Senate committee (budget 2013-14): operational costs for the Committee Office are expected to be \$7.4 million. This is an increase from the previous year's allocation of \$7 million, mainly due to the provision of funding to support the Joint Standing Committee on the Constitutional Recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples. The attached financial summary includes costs incurred 'by category of committee' for the four years 2009-10 to 2012-13.




