Finance	<p>1. Responsibility for Finance's Deregulation Unit has been absorbed within the Procurement Policy Branch. The Branch provides a coordination role for a range of initiatives underway in the Finance portfolio that will contribute towards reducing red tape for business and the not-for-profit sector, predominantly through changes to the overarching whole-of-government procurement, grants and cost recovery frameworks.</p> <p>The Deregulation Unit uses existing resources and also has access to resources from across the Department as required to pursue the deregulation agenda.</p> <p>a) The Deregulation Unit has identified \$72.3 Million in red tape reduction,</p>

The specific resources, including staffing levels, and security clearances will vary from time to time depending on the volume and nature of the material the unit is required to action.</p> <p>9. The AEC has nominated one person at the EL2 classification within each of the four functional areas identified as potentially having savings generated through the reduction of regulation. The red tape reduction work conducted by the EL2s is overseen by an SES officer. All officers undertake red tape reduction activities as part of his or her usual duties. Officers have finalised the data entry in the Department of Finance's Regulatory Stocktake Tool.</p> <p>7. - 8. Only Cabinet documents that relate to the functions of the AEC. Two EL2s have a Baseline Vetting classification and the SES officer is cleared to Negative Vetting Level 1.</p> <p>9. There is no formal name.</p>
