Topic: Workplace assessments

Senator LUDWIG asked:

Since Budget Estimates in June 2014:

1. How much has been spent on workplace ergonomic assessments?

- a) List each item of expenditure and cost.
- 2. Have any assessments, not related to an existing disability, resulted in changes to workplace equipment or set up?
- 3. If so, list each item of expenditure and cost related to those changes

Answer

All new employees are provided a workstation assessment upon commencement. Existing employees are provided with a workstation assessment upon request. Generally, workstation assessments are performed by trained employees in the department. Since 4 June 2014, \$450 was spent on training for these employees.

An external provider is used with more problematic assessments or where employees have particular concerns or injuries. The department paid \$921 to an external provider to perform workstation assessments since 4 June 2014.

The costs of items associated with the workstation assessments performed are below.

Monitor rise	\$39
Lumbar support cushions	\$27

One new sit/stand workstation has been procured as a result of a workplace assessment. The cost to the department was approximately \$3,000.
