Since Budget Estimates in June, 2014:

1. Has there been any change to the staffing profile of the department/agency?

2. Provide a list of changes to staffing numbers, broken down by classification level, division, home base location (including town/city and state)

Answer

1. Since Budget Estimates in June 2014, the staffing profile of the department has increased from 825 staff (as at pay period ending 4 June 2014) to 846 staff (at pay period ending 24 September 2014). A net variation increase of 21 staff. This variation shows as a reduction of 11 ongoing staff and an increase of 32 non-ongoing staff.

The increase in non-ongoing staffing over this period results in a net difference of 16 casual employees; 9 sessional employees and 12 full-time employees.

2. All these variation occurred with ACT at the following classification levels.
