## **Question:**

Senator WONG: Did you provide a question time brief?

Ms McDevitt: I would need to take that on notice, but not that I am aware of.

Senator WONG: So when the minister queried in the parliament the accuracy of that report,

that was on the basis of her opinion and not on any advice she received?

Senator Cash: The department would not necessarily be aware of what my answer was to the question when they do not know what the question was.

Senator WONG: Yes, of course they would. They always watch. I am sure they would be aware of what question you were asked and what was answered.

Senator Cash: I did not ask the question.

Senator WONG: What question was asked and what you answered, Minister? Can I have an answer to my question?

Ms Cross: I was just going to say, we will take that on notice. We certainly provided advice to the minister on the budget, which she may have drawn on in responding to the question. But without having the question in front of me, we would need to take that on notice.

## **Answer:**
