Sometimes people who have a concern about issues around women just contact the department. Have you received any concerns or questions on this issue?</p> <p><b>Ms Wallace:</b> Not that is standing out, no,</p> <p><b>Senator MOORE:</b> Can you check that as well to see whether there has been anything like that? My understanding is that the NPIP was cut recently. Given that its role was to provide feedback, particularly of what those in the community thought of the plan, can you tell me what was the policy reasoning for disbanding the NPIP?</p> <p><b>Ms McDevitt:</b> I might have to take some of the details on notice, but my understanding is that NPIP was disbanded. I presume you do not have an independent modelling capacity in the office?</p> <p><b>Ms McDevitt:</b> No, we do not.</p> <p><b>Senator WONG:</b> So you have not modelled how that might play out in terms of gender or different income levels, correct?</p> <p><b>Ms McDevitt:</b> We do not have that capacity.</p> <p><b>Senator WONG:</b> Has any such data been provided to you either during or subsequent to the budget process?</p> <p><b>Ms McDevitt:</b> I would have to take that on notice.....</p> <p><b>Senator WONG:</b> Well, it is a very simple question. PM&C	Wong	Enterprise bargaining agreements - enhancements	Corporate Services Division	<p><b>Senator WONG:</b> I am trying to get some quantitative or qualitative analysis here. Tell me: what is the best way to get that? I am trying to get a sense of how many employees would be in the position of, under government policy, losing what you have described as enhancements, which are the existing conditions, and I am also trying to get a sense of how many conditions there are and what they are. What information do you have that I can ask you to give me on notice?</p> <p><b>Mr Neal:</b> That latter is easiest in that it would be able to tell you which conditions across the nine other agreements would be considered to be more generous than the current PM&amp;C provisions. The first part of your question, which relates to usage or take-up, will depend on the number of employees currently preserved under the 24(3) determination. For example, about 50 or 60 staff came across from the Attorney-General's Department and 1,050 came from FaHCSIA. So, clearly, there are more people under the FaHCSIA agreement who would be affected. Urges Member States ... to mobilize and provide immediately technical expertise and additional medical capacity ...</p> <p>It goes on and on. Was the department aware of what was included in this resolution before Australia voted for it?</p> <p><b>Dr McCarthy:</b> My colleague advises me that we would have been consulted on the draft. Whether we would have been consulted on the final text—these things can be negotiated right up until the last moment. Is that—</p> <p><b>Dr McCarthy:</b> That is correct. I think all the briefs have been provided by the domestic policy area, and we have been consulted—that is right.</p> <p><b>Senator WONG:</b> On all of them or some of them?</p> <p><b>Dr McCarthy:</b> To be absolutely certain I would need to take it on notice.</p> <p><b>Senator WONG:</b> Sure. Take it on notice; that is fine. Has the Chief Medical Officer been involved in the preparation of any briefs to the Prime Minister?</p> <p><b>Dr McCarthy:</b> We have certainly drawn on advice from the Chief Medical Officer.
