- 2. Is this a different report a different report from that which was provided to the presiding officers as part of the process to terminate the former secretary (Ms Carol Mills)?
- 3. Has the report about the vacancy been completed?
- 4. If not, when can it be expected?
- 5. Is a copy made public and if it has not been made public, can it be?
- 6. What is the role of the Parliamentary Service Commissioner in the process to select a new secretary?

- 5. A copy has not been made public. The report contains personal information about candidates for the vacancy. It is not usual practice for such reports to be made public.
- 6. The Parliamentary Service Commissioner's role is governed by the *Parliamentary Service Act 1999*. The Presiding Officers are responsible for appointing the Secretary of a Parliamentary Department. The Presiding Officers cannot make an appointment unless they have received a report about the vacancy from the Parliamentary Service Commissioner.
