Question:

Can you provide the total amount spent by the Australian Government on education about and prevention on domestic violence for the period June 2014 to July 2019?

Answer:

- \$7.98 million from 2014-15 to 2016-17 for OurWATCH, which includes funding for *The Line* campaign:
 - \$2.34 million in 2014-15;
 - \$3.059 million in 2015-16; and
 - \$2.581 million in 2016-17 (funding beyond 2016-17 is yet to be agreed and is subject to Ministerial approval).
- \$5 million to expand the Safer Schools website to include resources for teachers, parents and students on respectful relationships.
- \$2.1 million for the eSafety Commissioner to develop a resource package about online safety for women, including for women from culturally and linguistically diverse communities.
- \$14 million will be provided to expand the DV-alert training programme to police, social workers, emergency department staff and community workers, and to work with the College of General Practitioners to develop and deliver specialised training to GPs across the country.
- \$15 million will be provided by the Commonwealth, and matched by states and territories, for a national campaign to change young people's attitudes to violence. The national campaign will commence in 2016.
