Question:

How are the Government's strict security laws inhibiting IGIS' role as Chief Watchdog?

## Answer:

The IGIS is not inhibited from providing effective oversight of the Australian intelligence agencies by any Australian laws. As noted in the IGIS 2014-15 Annual Report (at page 4), it is not always possible to publish detailed reports about inquiries because to do so could prejudice national security. However, this statement does not indicate the IGIS is inhibited from conducting inspections and inquiries with full access to the records and staff of the agencies.
