In October 2014 Estimates, Remote School Attendance Strategy attendance data was provided from NT, QLD and NSW. The most recent data is only for the NT and QLD. What happened?

a. What is the Government doing to facilitate the public release of all jurisdictions' school attendance data?

It is up to each State and Territory to agree to the release of their attendance data for RSAS Schools. The latest data that we have permission to release for NSW are provided.

Notes:

1) In January 2015 the NSW Attendance Policy was amended. Students who are absent on extended family holidays must now be recorded as absent. Previously parents/carers could apply for exemption from attendance which meant the absences did not count for national reporting purposes.

2) Ongoing data quality improvements can result in changes to the business rules in reports and affect the comparability of data with previous years.

3) Walgett Community College (Primary School) introduced a new software package for recording absences at the beginning of 2015. Walgett Community College (High School) and Wilcannia Central School introduced new software packages for recording absences during 2013. Changes in attendance rates from 2013 to 2015 may be attributable, in part, to the changes in software packages.
