Answer:

States in which electors had 11 marks against their name

The states in which two electors had 11 marks against their name on certified lists at the 2016 federal election were Queensland and New South Wales.

State/territory breakdown of multiple mark letters issued

Following the close of rolls at the 2016 federal election, the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) sent letters to 4,627 electors whose records showed they were marked off the roll more than once at the 2013 federal election - and were subsequently referred to the Australian Federal Police. This excluded electors who were 70 years or over (as at 1 July 2016), silent electors, registered eligible overseas electors (and kin), registered itinerant electors, registered Antarctic electors, and electors with an overseas postal address.
