Question:

In the 2014-15 and the 2015-16 financial years, did any Australian Government Departments and/or government agencies purchase A4 copy paper from a country or mill that was subject to a dumping or countervailing investigation by the Australian Anti-dumping Commission? If so, please provide a breakdown of the Department and/or agency, the country or origin of the paper, the status of the investigation when the purchasing decision was made, the supplier, and the value of the contract.

Answer:

During 2014-15 there was one copy paper related dumping or countervailing investigation by the Australian Anti-dumping Commission. It concerned copy paper from China and commenced on 10 October 2013 and terminated on 7 August 2014. In summary, the Commissioner determined that there had been no dumping, or that the dumping had been, or may be, negligible and therefore terminated the investigation. Refer Anti-Dumping Notice 2014/69¹. Attachment A provides details of relevant purchases from the Stationery and Office Supplies (SOS) Whole of Australian Government arrangement for the period 1 July 2014 to August 2014 during which time the investigation was ongoing.

During 2015-16 there was one copy paper related dumping or countervailing investigation by the Australian Anti-dumping Commission. It concerned copy paper from China, Brazil, Indonesia and Thailand, and commenced on 12 April 2016 and is currently underway.

On 28 September and 4 November 2016, the Anti-Dumping Commissioner issued Preliminary Affirmative Determinations (PAD). The PADs imposed some limited securities. A final recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary is due no later than 23 January 2017, refer Public Record ADC 341². Attachment B provides details of relevant purchases from the SOS arrangement for the period April 2016 to 30 June 2016 during which time the investigation was ongoing but no PADs had been issued.

The Anti-dumping Commission investigates alleged dumping and subsidisation of goods imported into Australia and imposes duties to address material injury to the Australian Industry that manufactures similar or the same goods. The work of the Commission complies with rules of the World Trade Organization and Australian legislation³. In the above two matters the Commission has not advised purchasers to avoid purchasing paper from the relevant countries.

The SOS arrangement is mandatory for non-corporate Commonwealth entities subject to the *Public Governance, Performance and Accountability Act 2013* (PGPA Act). Entities are required to purchase their stationery needs, including paper, through the SOS panellists and must not procure products directly from other suppliers. The Department of Finance manages the SOS panellists' Product Lists, requiring that products proposed by panellists meet the relevant requirements. For example, for general use copy paper, the product must have recognised environmental chain of custody certifications, such as Forestry Stewardship Council (FSC), Programme for the Endorsement of Forest Certification (PEFC), and the Australian Forestry Standard (AFS).
