Please provide a list of all organisations that applied for funding under each for the five streams, what programme they applied under and to deliver what services.

Please provide a list of organisations that were funded under each of the five streams, what they were funded to deliver, and the quantum of their funding each year over the life of the agreement?

Please provide a list of all organisations that applied, but were not provided with any funding, including those that had previously been funded by a Commonwealth Government department.

**Answer:**

1. Under the Commonwealth Grant Rules and Guidelines, the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet (PM&C) is required to publish all grant funding activity within 14 days of execution of grant funding agreements. The grant information published on PM&C's website includes all Indigenous Advancement Strategy (IAS) funding, which commenced July 2014. Due to privacy and commercial confidentiality requirements, PM&C cannot provide details of organisations that have applied and been unsuccessful for funding.
