Senator SKYE KAKOSCHKE-MOORE:

On 2 September 2016 the Government announced the role of the Defence Force Ombudsman (DFO) would expand to provide an independent defence abuse reporting function.

- 1. How many employees will the DFO have that will specifically deal with defence abuse reports?
- 2. What training will these employees have?

Answer:

- 1. As at 31 October 2016, the DFO has 25 staff. Recruitment activity is currently underway. The total number of employees will depend on the number of reports of abuse received.
- 2. DFO staff will undergo training to ensure that reports of abuse are managed sensitively, efficiently and without causing further harm to complainants. A particular focus is on trauma-informed care and vicarious trauma.
