Just a clarification: in terms of your Indigenous employment in the stores, could you provide positions and locations for us for each of those? I know that Senator Lines also made reference to a couple of things there. Also, with the subsidies, could you let us know for each of the stores what kind of support they receive financially in terms of those subsidies? How do you break that down for each of the stores?
