#### **Question No. 193**

## Senator Ludwig asked the following question at the hearing on 24 February 2014:

- 1) How many officers are responsible for preparing the department, agency, Minister or representing Minister's briefing pack for the purposes of Question Time?
- 2) How many officer hours are spent each sitting day on preparing that information?
- i. Please break down the hours by officer APS classification
- 3) Are drafts shown to the Minister or their office before Question Time?
- i. If so, when does this occur?
- ii. How many versions of this information are shown to the minister or their office?
- 4) Does the minister or their office make any contributions, edits or suggestions for departmental changes to this information?
- i. If so, when does this occur?
- ii. What officer hours were spent on making these edits? Please break down the hours by officer APS classification.
- 5) Provide each of the contents page of the Minister and representing Minister's Question Time folder prepared by the department for the week of 11 February 2014.

#### The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

- 1) Officers of the department are tasked with preparation of question time briefings for ministers on an 'as required' basis. The number of staff affected will differ on any given day.
- 2) Officers do not record or attribute their time in a way that would enable this information to be provided.
- 3) Question Time briefs are provided to minister's offices sufficiently prior to question time each day.
  - (a) It is a matter for ministerial staff to review these briefs and they may amend or seek further information as they consider appropriate.
  - (b) Question Time briefs are reviewed and updated regularly throughout sitting periods to ensure information remains accurate.
- 4) Yes.
  - (a) On occasion minister's office staff will edit some question time briefs and the department will review the edited brief for accuracy.
  - (b) Officers do not attribute their time in a way that would enable this information to be provided.
- 5) The contents pages are internal working documents prepared by the relevant Minister's office.
