- 2) Merrepen Art Centre's 2013-14 funding was not finalised prior to the Government implementing its assessment of all discretionary grants spending. Subsequently, at the agreement of the Finance Minister, funding for 2013-14 was offered and accepted.
- 3) It is correct that Senator Peris and the Member for Solomon wore outfits made from Merrepen fabrics at the opening of the 44th Parliament of Australia.
