Senator Ludwig asked the following question at the hearing on 9 February 2016:

Since the change of Prime Minister on 14 September, 2015:

- 1. How much did each department/agency spend on taxis during the specified period? Provide a breakdown for each business group in each department/agency.
- 2. What are the reasons for taxi costs?
- 3. How much did the department spend on taxis during the specified period for their minister or minister's office?

The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

- 1. The portfolio's response is provided below. In some cases, it is not possible to separately account for taxi and car hire, or to identify business units for the expenditure.
- 2. Taxis are used as a means of transport when appropriate for work-related travel or otherwise to attend work-related meetings and events.
- 3. Between the period 1 September 2015 to 29 February 2016 (inclusive), the department spent \$35 650.96 on taxis (including Comcar and other taxi services) to the ministers and their offices.
