Application for conferral of Australian Citizenship– Request for further information

I refer to your application for conferral of Australian citizenship that you lodged on 12/2016

Subsection 24(3) of the *Australian Citizenship Act 2007*, provides that a person must not be approved to become an Australia citizen unless the decision maker is satisfied of the person's identity.

Identity

To assist in finalising your application the Department requires certified copies of any original documents which support your claimed identity and that of your children born outside Australia.

The documents should provide information about any name you have used either in Australia or outside Australia, information about your date and place of birth and about your parents. These documents should be issued by a country other than Australia. Examples of the types of documents include, but are not limited to:

- identity card/s
- birth certificates, or other forms of documentation from the time of your birth such as hospital records, baptismal certificates or register entries
- passport/s or other forms of travel documentation
- driver licence, such as for a car, truck or boat
- household registrations
- school certificates, employment records, professional registrations, financial institution statements, taxation notices, voting registration, or any other documents that show use of your claimed identity in the community before you came to Australia.
