Senator Singh asked the following question at the hearing on 26-29 May 2014:

- 1. I refer to this year's Portfolio Budget Statement for the Attorney-General's Department at page 32. Please confirm where each of the Indigenous Law and Justice Programs have been moved to pursuant to the Administrative Arrangement Order of 18 September 2013?
- 2. Have there been any cuts to the total funding for each of these important programs?
- 3. How will the transfer of these programs and any cuts better support access to justice for Indigenous Australians?

The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

- 1. Three Indigenous Law and Justice programmes moved to the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet pursuant to the Administrative Arrangement Order of 18 September 2013:
- Indigenous Justice Programme
- Family Violence Prevention Legal Services for Indigenous Australians, and
- Stronger Futures in the Northern Territory community safety and justice measure.

The Indigenous Legal Assistance Programme remains the responsibility of the Attorney-General's Department.

- 2. The Indigenous Legal Assistance Programme was reduced by \$13.25m over four years as part of the MYEFO process. Questions about the other programmes should be directed to the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet.
- 3. This is a question for the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet.
