Senator Bilyk asked the following question at the hearing on 27 and 28 May 2015:

Senator BILYK: Are you able to tell me what the current budget of the ACC is?

The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

In 2014–15, the Australian Crime Commission (ACC) has budgeted to receive the following:

- \$88.149 million in appropriation revenue
- \$5.639 million fee-for-service revenue from Commonwealth partners and state police agencies, and
- \$1.619 million Proceeds of Crime Act funding for the new policy initiative Confiscated Assets Taskforce.

Subsequently, funding of \$18,107,000 from the Commonwealth's Confiscated Assets Account has been approved for three law enforcement programs to be delivered by the ACC, including:

- \$9,799,000 for stage one of the National Criminal Intelligence System (NCIS)
- \$3,386,000 provided over two years for controlled operations against money laundering, and
- \$4,922,000 provided over four years for trial secondments to International partners.
