Dear Mr Merkel

Thank you for your letters of 12 August and 19 May 2014 and your previous correspondence enclosing the report by Indigenous Art Code Limited.

I note your recommendation that the Government investigate the implementation of a mandatory code for the Indigenous visual art industry on the basis of the problem of alleged unethical dealing in the industry, as well as the report's views about structural limitations experienced by the voluntary Indigenous Art Code. I have considered your proposal carefully, however have decided not to pursue alternative regulatory options at this stage.

Given the success of the Code in some areas of its operations, I would like to see it continue in its voluntary capacity to allow it more time to build on its strengths and to continue to generate positive change within the industry. However, I will keep the matter under review.
