Senator Ludwig asked the following written question from the 20 November and 11 December 2014 hearings.

Since Budget Estimates in June, 2014:

- 1. For departments/agencies that provide mobile phones to Ministers and/or Parliamentary Secretaries and/or their offices, what type of mobile phone has been provided and the costs?
 - a) Itemise equipment and cost broken down by staff or minister classification
- 2. Has electronic equipment (such as ipad, laptop, wireless card, vasco token, blackberry, mobile phone (list type if relevant), thumb drive, video cameras) been provided by the department/agency? If yes provide a list of:
 - a) What is provided?
 - b) The purchase cost.
 - c) The ongoing cost.
 - d) A list of any accessories provided for the equipment and the cost of those accessories. (e.g. iPad keyboards, laptop carry bags, additional chargers etc).
 - e) A breakdown of what staff and staff classification receives each item.

The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

1-1a) The department generally provides iPhones to ministers and their staff as the standard mobile phone device. The purchase cost for an iPhone is currently approximately \$750.

It would require an unreasonable diversion of resources to itemise equipment and costs for each item broken down by staff or minister classification.

2a-e) The department provides the following electronic equipment, as required, to staff to assist them with carrying out their duties:

- desktop PCs and laptops
- mobile phone devices (eg iPhone)
- iPads
- printers/multi-function devices
- internet protocol (IP) phones
- desktop scanners
- remote access tokens
- Bluetooth headsets
- business card scanners
- USB storage devices
- digital voice recorders
- digital cameras

- shredders
- televisions
- KVM switches
- portable stereos
- transcription equipment, and
- wireless internet dongles.

It would require an unreasonable diversion of resources to provide the purchase and ongoing costs for each item broken down by staff and staff classification.
