Senator Ludwig (Written) asked:

Please detail what structures, officials, offices, units, taskforce or other processes has the department dedicated to meeting the government's red tape reduction targets?

- 1. What is the progress of that red tape reduction target
- 2. How many officers have been placed in those units and at what level?
- 3. How have they been recruited?
- 4. What process was used for their appointment?
- 5. What is the total cost of this unit?
- 6. What is the estimated total salary cost of the officers assigned to the unit.
- 7. Do members of the unit have access to cabinet documents?
- 8. Lease list the security classification and date the classification was issued for each officer, broken down by APS or SES level, in the red tape reduction unit or similar body.
- 9. What is the formal name given to this unit/taskforce/team/workgroup or agency within the department?

### Answer:

As at 20 October 2014, the Immigration and Border Protection portfolio (the portfolio) has a dedicated deregulation unit, led by a designated SES officer.

- 1. The portfolio is progressing towards its 2014 red tape reduction target and expects to achieve the target by the final reporting period in December 2014.
- 2. As at 20 October 2014, the portfolio's deregulation unit includes one Executive Level 2 officer, six Executive Level 1 officers and two APS 6 officers. One of these APS 6 officers was on a temporary assignment with another work area until November 2014.
- 3. The portfolio's deregulation unit staff were recruited internally through an Expression of Interest process or were appointed by internal reassignment of existing resources. The Executive Level 2 officer was on a six month transfer from the Department of the Treasury.
- 4. See response to Question 3.
- 5. The total cost of the portfolio's deregulation unit from 1 July 2014 to 31 October 2014 is \$429 167.

- 6. The salary cost of the portfolio's deregulation unit from 1 July 2014 to 31 October 2014 is \$377 159.
- 7. Officers who hold the appropriate security clearance have access to relevant cabinet documents on a need to know basis.
- 8. As at 20 October 2014, the security classification and date the classification issued for each officer in the portfolio's deregulation unit is as follows:
