(SE16/006) - Mr Wyatt Roy - Minister notified of travel - Programme 1.1: Border Enforcement

Senator Carr, Kim (L&CA 42) asked:

Senator KIM CARR: Okay. Maybe this is a question for the minister: when was the minister advised of Mr Roy's trip to Iraq? Senator Cash: I would need to take that on notice, to seek the information. Senator KIM CARR: What was the date of Mr Roy's departure? Mr Outram: I do not know the day of his departure. Senator KIM CARR: Would you take that on notice, please? Mr Outram: Yes. Senator KIM CARR: And at what port did he leave from? Mr Outram: Similarly, we would need to take that on notice. Senator KIM CARR: And did he use a SmartGate or was he questioned by officers? Mr Outram: All these questions, obviously, relate to-Senator Cash: They need to be taken on notice. Mr Outram: They need to be taken on notice, yes. Senator KIM CARR: Has there been any review of the communications or interactions with ABF staff, in regard to Mr Roy's travel, including counterterrorism unit officers? Mr Outram: I do not believe so but, again, we will take that on notice just to be absolutely certain. Senator KIM CARR: And you will be able to advise me as to whether or not he had a visa when he left Australia to go to Iraq.

Answer:

When was the minister advised of Mr Roy's trip to Iraq?

The Department is not aware of when the Minister was advised of Mr Roy's trip to Iraq.

What was the date of Mr Roy's departure?

My Roy departed Australia on 07 September 2016.

What port did he leave from, did he use a SmartGate or was he questioned by officers?

The individual departed Australia from Brisbane airport and was processed through an E-Gate. He was not questioned by an ABF Officer.

Has there been any review of the communications or interactions with ABF staff, in regard to Mr Roy's travel, including counter-terrorism officers?

No.

And will you be able to advise me as to whether or not he had a visa when he left Australia to go to Iraq?

No. Under the *Migration Act 1958*, Australian citizens have the right to enter and depart Australia unfettered. However, it is a citizen's responsibility to ensure they have the appropriate visas to travel to their intended destination(s).
