

## **QUESTION TAKEN ON NOTICE**

### **SUPPLEMENTARY BUDGET ESTIMATES HEARING : 17 October 2016**

#### **IMMIGRATION AND BORDER PROTECTION PORTFOLIO**

#### **(SE16/017) - Nauru Files - Programme 1.5: IMA Offshore Management**

Senator Reynolds, Linda (L&CA 71) asked:

Senator REYNOLDS: On that point, with different committees at different times and on different inquiries, a lot of the allegations and a lot of the testimony we have had appear to be resident on resident and complaints are in terms of critical, major and minor issues. Would you have those figures available, or could you take them on notice?

Mr Woodford-Smith: I will take them on notice, but I can confirm that the large majority of the incidents involve either single residents of the RPCs or residents on residents or engaged or interacting with other residents.

Senator REYNOLDS: Thank you.

*Answer:*

Of the 2123 Nauru File incidents which occurred in Nauru between 12 May 2013 and 29 October 2015, 958 (45.1 per cent) involved a single resident and 525 (24.7 per cent) involved a resident interacting with another resident.
