Senator RUSTON: I am interested in the Green Army projects that have been committed to in the states—and I am sure there is a piece of paper somewhere that says what they are. I am particularly interested in the South Australian projects. You can take that on notice. I do not expect you to sit here and list every one of them.

Mr Sullivan: We can take that on notice.

**Answer:**

The Government committed to a number of Green Army Projects during the 2013 election. Those committed for South Australia include:

- *Mitcham Hills woody weed and feral olive eradication.*
- *Bowman Park biodiversity, amenity, and community awareness enhancement project.*
- *Port Lincoln heritage trail development project.*
- *Mt. Laura conservation reserve preservation and Whyalla coastal zone remediation projects.*
- *Port Augusta place-space redevelopment and arid-smart plant propagation project.*
- *River Torrens repair projects.*
- *Marion and Onkaparinga riparian restoration project.*
- *Goolwa to Wellington Local Action Planning Association project.*
