#### **Answer:**

- 1. NBN Co has subscriptions to Foxtel's Business Information package in order to stay informed of relevant public affairs and events. NBN Co does not provide Media subscriptions of any kind to the Ministers office. For the period 1 September 2013 to 31 October 2013 expenditure was \$1,527 + GST.
- 2. NBN Co has subscriptions for The Australian Financial Review, The Sydney Morning Herald, The Age, The Herald Sun, The Daily Telegraph, and The Australian. The subscriptions are to ensure the company can track relevant public developments, business news and industry commentary. For the period 1 September 2013 to 31 October 2013 expenditure was \$2,599 + GST.
- 3. There is no central repository for magazine subscriptions alone.
- 4. Individuals are able to order periodicals relevant to their work via their expenses.
