**Topic: MEDIA MONITORING**

**Senator Minchin asked:**

Does the Department or Minister's office use Media Monitors to monitor door stops at Parliament House during sitting weeks?

Who requested the doors to be monitored and when?

Does the Department get transcripts of all door stop interviews of Members and Senators during sitting weeks or just door stops relevant to the Department's responsibilities?

Does the Minister's office get transcripts of the door stop interviews of Members and Senators during sitting weeks?

How much does each door stop transcript included add to the cost to the Department?

Has the requirement to include online sites in the media monitoring contract for the portfolio added to the cost of providing media monitoring services? If so, by how much?

**Answer:**

No, unless specifically tasked by either the Department or Minister's Office to do so. **Occasionally the Minister's Office requests the Department to obtain a media monitors transcript of a doorstep interview.**

As above – only when requested to do so. Both the Senate and House of Representatives would be monitored only during sitting weeks.

The Department would only request transcripts relevant to the Department or Minister's responsibilities.

Only if relevant and usually requested through the Department's Media and Speeches Team.

The cost would depend on the length of door stop, with an additional cost incurred any time a door stop transcript is ordered.

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The Department continues to be charged per news clip as set out in the contract with Media Monitors, which includes a limited number of online sites.

- The cost of media monitoring services depends on the number of articles containing the relevant keywords. Therefore, the total cost of this service can depend on current issues in the media and the mix of these between online and offline. As this mix is constantly changing, a breakdown is not readily available.
