How many students have had their application for independent youth allowance rejected since 1 January 2012? If any, for what reasons?

ANSWER

For the period 1 January - 24 February 2012, and where a rejection reason has been recorded on the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) payment system, 272 applicants had their application for independent Youth Allowance (student) rejected.

Rejections and reasons are only recorded for certain categories of independent Youth Allowance (student). Rejections due to failure to satisfy workforce participation requirements have only been recorded since 1 January 2012. In order to protect the privacy of individuals, populations less than twenty are reported as "<20".
