## Senator BUSHBY asked:

- 550. Could the Department provide a list of all discretionary grants, including ad hoc and one-off grants for this financial year to date? Please provide details of the recipients, the intended use of the grants and what locations have benefited from the grants.
- 551. Has the Department complied with interim requirements relating to the publication of discretionary grants?

#### **Answer**

550. For the financial year to 29 February 2012, discretionary grants of approximately \$1.3m have been approved by ASIC. These grants were paid from ASIC's Assetless Administration Fund (AA Fund) which is used to finance preliminary investigations and reports by liquidators into the failure of companies with few or no assets. A breakdown by location is shown below:
