Senator BUSHBY—Is anybody able to help me with the next question, which is: what were the top 10 occupations receiving super co-contribution payments from the government where occupation is determined via the declaration in individual income tax returns or another appropriate method for the same years?

The following table lists the top 10 occupations of beneficiaries of a co-contribution payment in respect of the 2005-06, 2006-07 and 2007-08 years of entitlement.

These figures are based on the occupation listed in the individual income tax return, for the respective year, of recipients of a co-contribution payment.

^{*}All taxpayers with salary and wage income are required to enter an appropriate occupation description when completing question one of their individual tax return, which is transformed into a 6-digit code. If the occupation entered does not have a corresponding code, they are assigned a generic code - occupation not listed.

^{**}Where an individual does not have salary and wage income, they are not required to complete question one, and as such the occupation field will be left blank. This could be the case for individuals who are (for example) self employed. The self employed became eligible to receive co-contribution payments from the 2007-08 financial year.
