Senator NASH: Did everybody hear that out there? I am doing my job. Just quickly on apprenticeships. I might just make sure I have finished off all of that first. Again, I am happy for you to take this on notice. Obviously there has been some work done over recent years about the costs of living away from home for tertiary students. I think we were looking at around \$15,000 to \$20,000 a year in 2007 from the evidence and reporting then. Has there been any more recent data about the cost of relocation for students having to move away from home? I am very happy for you to take that on notice. I am just keen to know—that was a while ago now—if there has been any further work done since that time in trying to ascertain if that figure has adjusted at all. I think that is it for youth allowance. Some quick questions about apprenticeships and then I will be done. Have we got the same people or different people for apprenticeships or are we all good?
