Australian Small Business Commissioner – Role Statement

The Australian Small Business Commissioner will advocate and advise on small business interests within the Australian Government and bring to light new opportunities to enhance outcomes for small businesses throughout Australia. The Commissioner will adopt a leadership role in consultation with industry and collaboration with other jurisdictions to promote a coordinated approach to small business issues and encourage information sharing on small business matters.

The Australian Small Business Commissioner will be appointed by, and report directly to, the Minister for Small Business. The Commissioner will also work cooperatively with the Department of Industry, Innovation, Science, Research and Tertiary Education to share information on small business issues.

The Small Business Commissioner will be responsible for:

- advocacy and representation of small business interests and concerns to the Australian Government to ensure that policies and initiatives take into account the needs of small business;
- promoting Government policies and small business activities;
- providing a national gateway to small business information, education, assistance and advice through the *National Information and Referral Service*;
- working with key small business stakeholders, such as other small business commissioners
 to promote a coordinated approach to small business issues and encourage information
 sharing on small business matters; and
- oversight of existing Commonwealth funded small business mediation services provided for under the Franchising Code of Conduct, Horticulture Code of Conduct, and Oilcode (mandatory industry codes under the Competition and Consumer Act 2010) and the voluntary Produce and Grocery Industry Code of Conduct.
