Privacy and confidentiality

The use and disclosure of information provided to the Department by applicants for registration and participants under the Automotive Competitiveness and Investment Scheme (ACIS) is regulated by the relevant provisions and/or penalties of the ACIS Administration Act 1999 (the Act), the Industry Research and Development Act 1986 (the IR&D Act), the Public Service Act 1999, the Public Service Regulations, the Privacy Act 1988, the Crimes Act 1914 and the Criminal Code Act 1995, as well as the common law.

The Minister, the Industry Research and Development Board (the Board) and the Department will use the information provided in this form for the purposes of discharging their respective functions under ACIS and for related purposes.

These functions include determining eligibility for registration as a participant, determining eligibility for ACIS credits, considering, assessing and merit ranking of eligible R&D projects, conducting technical assessments of funded projects or activities, negotiating and executing funding agreements under the ACIS Stage 2 MVP R&D Scheme, calculating the amount of duty credits that are to be issued to participants and assisting with compliance activities.

While the Minister, the Department and the Board will seek to protect sensitive information from disclosure to external parties, ACIS applicants and customers should be aware that public disclosure of some information could occur if the release of the information is required or permitted by law. For example, the Department may be required to provide information in response to a resolution of Parliament or an order of a Court. Section 115A of the Act allows the Minister to publish certain information on participants (in particular, that a person is or was a participant under ACIS and the amount of duty credit received by the person in an ACIS year) and section 47 of the IR&D Act allows the Board to disclose certain information within Government.

Following approval of an application or a quarterly return, the broad details of the application or quarterly return (for example, the identity of the applicant or participant, the amount of ACIS credits to be issued, and in the case of the ACIS MVP R&D Scheme, a brief description of the project) may be disclosed for purposes such as promoting the program, reporting on its operation and policy development. This information may also be used in answering questions from the Parliament and its committees.

The Department and the Board may also use information received in applications or quarterly returns for any other legitimate Departmental or Board business.

As part of the assessment of an application or a quarterly return, the Department or the Board may need to consult with and provide material from the application or quarterly return to other government agencies or bodies, other organisations and/or relevant individuals, in order to substantiate any claims or statements made in the application form or quarterly return, or to otherwise assist in the assessment of the application or quarterly return. If this occurs, the Department or the Board will endeavour to ensure that the parties that are consulted observe appropriate confidentiality.

Detailed confidential information contained in applications or quarterly returns may be disclosed for audit purposes to contractors engaged by the Department and to other Commonwealth agencies for audit, reporting and law enforcement purposes. Further, the Department or the Board may release confidential information if it obtains your consent to do so.

When to submit an Application for Registration

Entities wishing to access ACIS must first make an application for registration as a Motor Vehicle Producer (MVP), Automotive Component Producer (ACP), Automotive Machine Tool Producer (AMTP) or Automotive Service Provider (ASP). Applicants may apply for registration at any time. An application for registration will be processed within sixty days, unless further information is required.

AusIndustry must approve an application for registration before the applicant becomes eligible to receive ACIS credits. Once registered for the scheme, customers have an obligation to make quarterly returns for assistance. ACIS customers may only receive ACIS credits from the quarter in which their registration is granted. ACIS customers must submit their first Quarterly Return within 45 days after the end of the quarter in which their registration took effect or such longer period as AusIndustry allows.

In completing this form we strongly recommend that the customer refer to Section 2 of the ACIS Customer Guidelines – Completing Application for Registration Forms. All ACIS Guidelines are available at the AusIndustry website www.ausindustry.gov.au/acis.

Note: All values and figures should be recorded in full, as whole numbers. Do not use decimal points or round to the nearest thousand.

When completing this form, customers are encouraged to be concise and factual in all responses.
