377. Has the Department complied with interim requirements relating to the publication of discretionary grants?

Answer:

375. In 2010-11, discretionary grants of approximately \$2.812m were approved by ASIC. These grants were paid from ASIC's Assetless Administration Fund (AA Fund) which is used to finance preliminary investigations and reports by liquidators into the failure of companies with few or no assets. AA Fund grants are only made to liquidators registered with ASIC. A breakdown by location is shown below:
